SYRESHAM CEMETERY EXTENSION

For many years Syresham Parish Council have been in discussion with Les Hawkins, who now owns what used to be called Priory Fields opposite The Priory in Wappenham Road. Last year the BRICC (formerly PCC) got planning permission from the district council to extend this cemetery, which is down to its last five vacant slots.

Les Hawkins kindly donated to St James Church, owners of the cemetery, 1/10th of an acre of adjoining grazing land to the West side of the existing cemetery. Just before lockdown, Sebs Arboricultural Services felled seven conifers which had marked the boundary, ground out the stumps and Hawkins broke up the foundations of

an old stable, hopefully to provide smooth ground for future use.



South Northants unsurprisingly asked for the same metal black railings to be used, rather than post and rail which the Hawkins family had kindly offered. So, with legal fees, both the vendors and Peterborough's, this small extension will come in costing nearly £10000. Hawkins Fencing have successfully quoted for the new railings and, as soon as the work is finished, we plan to have a consecration ceremony to bless the new plot. With more and more people now being cremated, we hope that this extension will last another 50 years; the existing cemetery having been consecrated at the beginning of the last century.

In other 'lockdown' news, we have commissioned a stone mason to make a number of 'Reserved' stones for graveyard and cemetery to avoid any confusion when people's time comes. Also to make stones for 'unmarked' cremated remains areas.

We are also re-paving the area just outside St James Church to give us a No Parking area and to smarten up the approach to the church, when it re-opens.
